Justine Moore is a native New Mexican who has been working as a professional actor, teacher and playwright in New York, Los Angeles and Washington DC for over fifteen years. She holds a Master of Fine Arts in Acting from Columbia University where she studied with Kristin Linklater, Andrei Serban, Anne Bogart, Niki Wolcz and Bart Sher. She has performed internationally in France, winning the coveted Theatre Amandiers-Nanterre Award for the play *Godard (distant and right)* directed by Robert Woodruff. In the United States she has performed and understudied on Broadway, in Regional Theatre, Off-Broadway and in Los Angeles where she was nominated for the prestigious Ovation Award and LA Weekly Award for her one-woman show *Ecstasy and the Ice Queen*. She recently finished writing the book of her solo show in which five major publishers (including HarperCollins, Simon & Schuster and Random House) have expressed keen interest. She last performed *Ecstasy and the Ice Queen* in New York City's La MaMa, E.T.C. in October 2008.

Working at the university and professional level for the past fifteen years, Ms. Moore incorporated her expertise as an actor, dancer, writer and Clinical Frame Correction Specialist with various theatre movement modalities. Calling on her skills in the techniques of Dance, Viewpoints, Yoga, Pilates, Feldenkrais, Alexander, Laban and Biomechanics, Ms. Moore created a unique synergy of theatre movement education. While correcting her students' skeletal framework deviations, she also invigorates the actor's imaginations. Possessing a neutral frame, Moore's students are free to dynamically portray any character without tainting it with the actor's habits. Neutrality, combined with a fertile backstory, imbues her students with a profound level of ease, power and specificity on stage. This lifelong movement and acting education enables students to reach new artistic heights. An award winning actor and Framework Correction Specialist, her clients include actors, opera singers and athletes.
